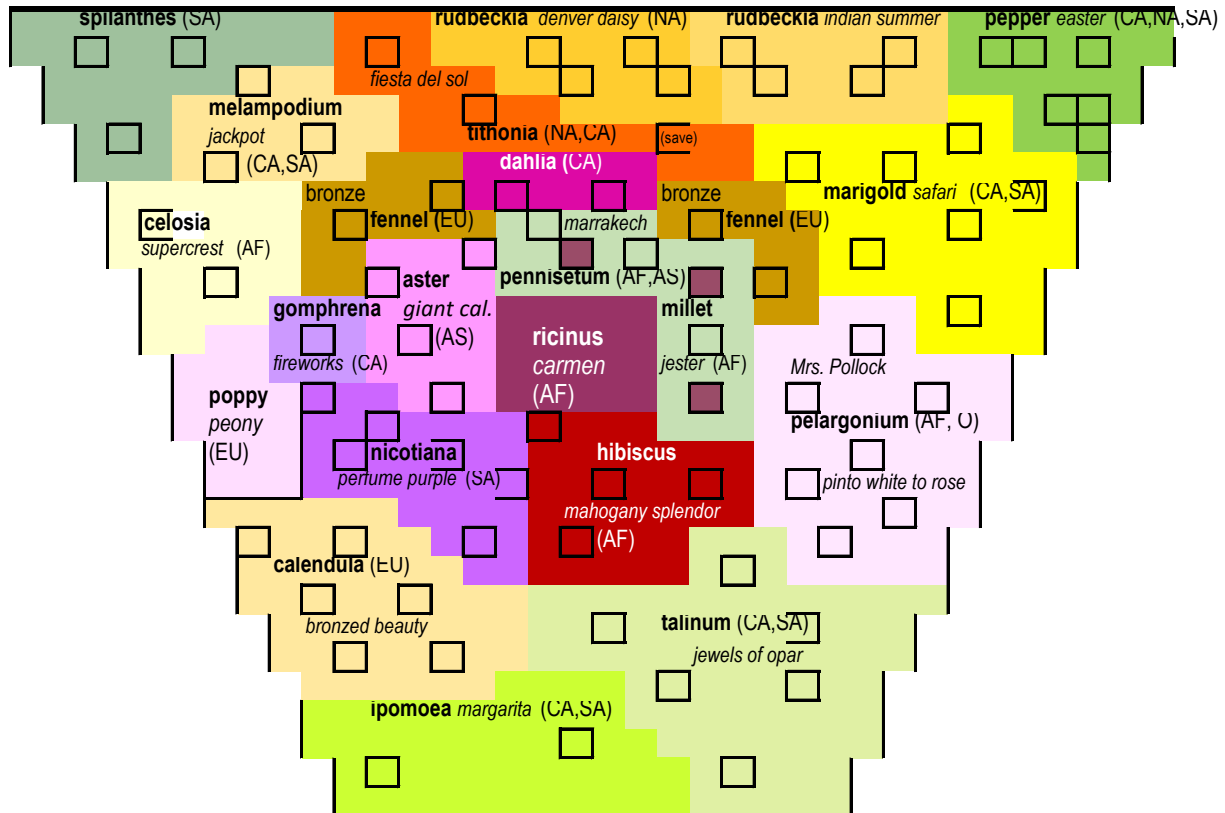

Ornamental Annuals from Around the Worlds

AF = Africa (plants shown: celosia, hibiscus, pennisetum grass, millet, pelargonim, ricinus)

AS = Asia (plants shown: aster, pennisetum grass)

EU = Europe (plants shown: calendula, fennel, poppy)

O = Oceania (plants shown: pelargonium)

NA = North America (plants shown: pepper, rudbeckia, tithonia)

CA = Central America (plants shown: dahlia, gomphrena, ipomoea, marigold, melampodium, pepper, talinum, tithonia)

SA = South America (plants shown: ipomoea, marigold, melampodium, nicotiana, pepper, spilanthes, talinum)

Dahlias are generally grown from tubers that have been overwintered indoors. These were seed-grown and are prized for their dark colored leaves. Recommend cutting them back if they get too tall which will prevent bloom but increase the plentiful leaf production.

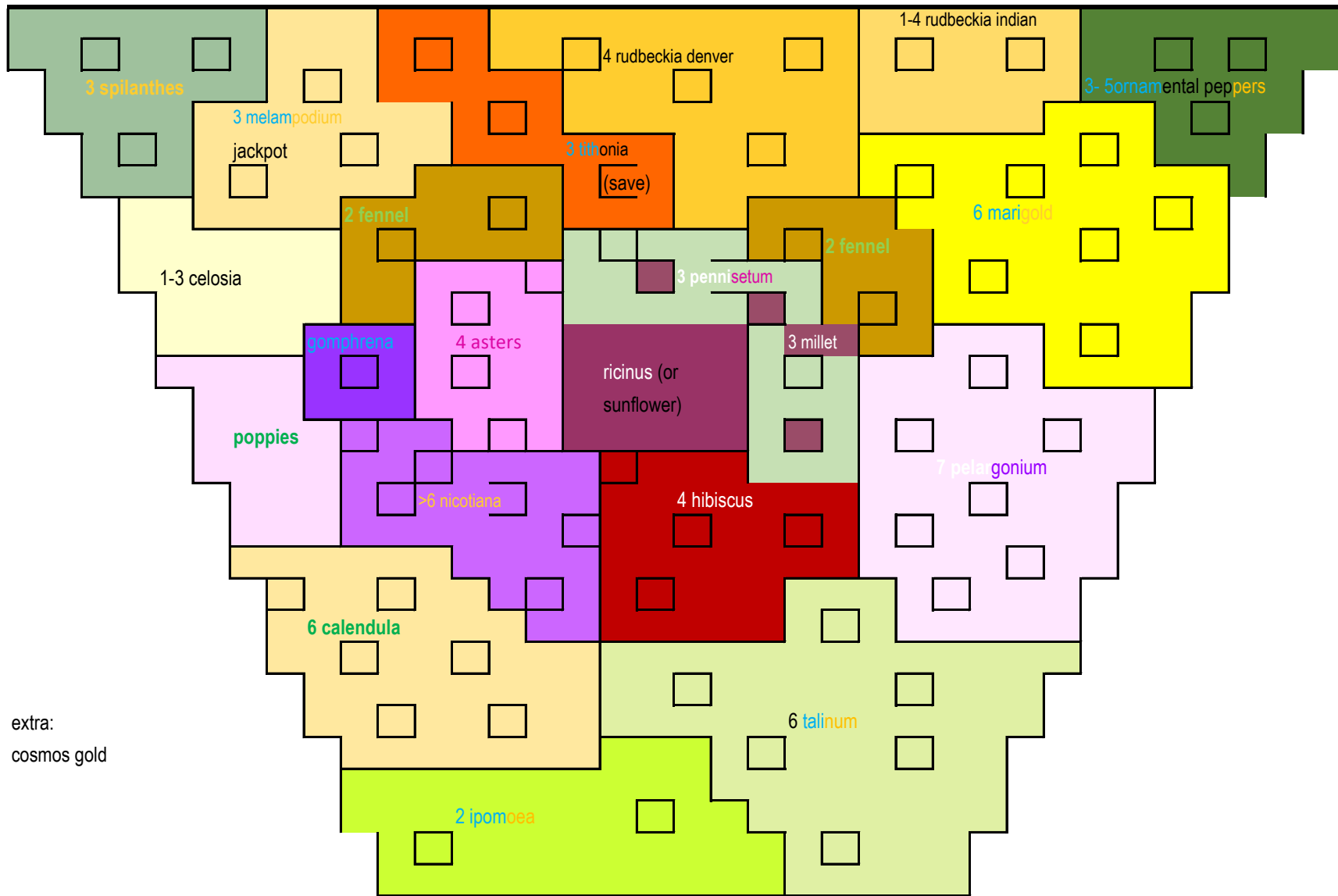
The **Papaver** (poppy) grown here is both a source of poppy seeds for use in baking, and opium for medicinal purposes.

Pelargonium, Ipomoea and Hibiscus are actually tender perennials which are saved over winter through cuttings though the hibiscus and some of the pelargoniums were originally grown from seed.

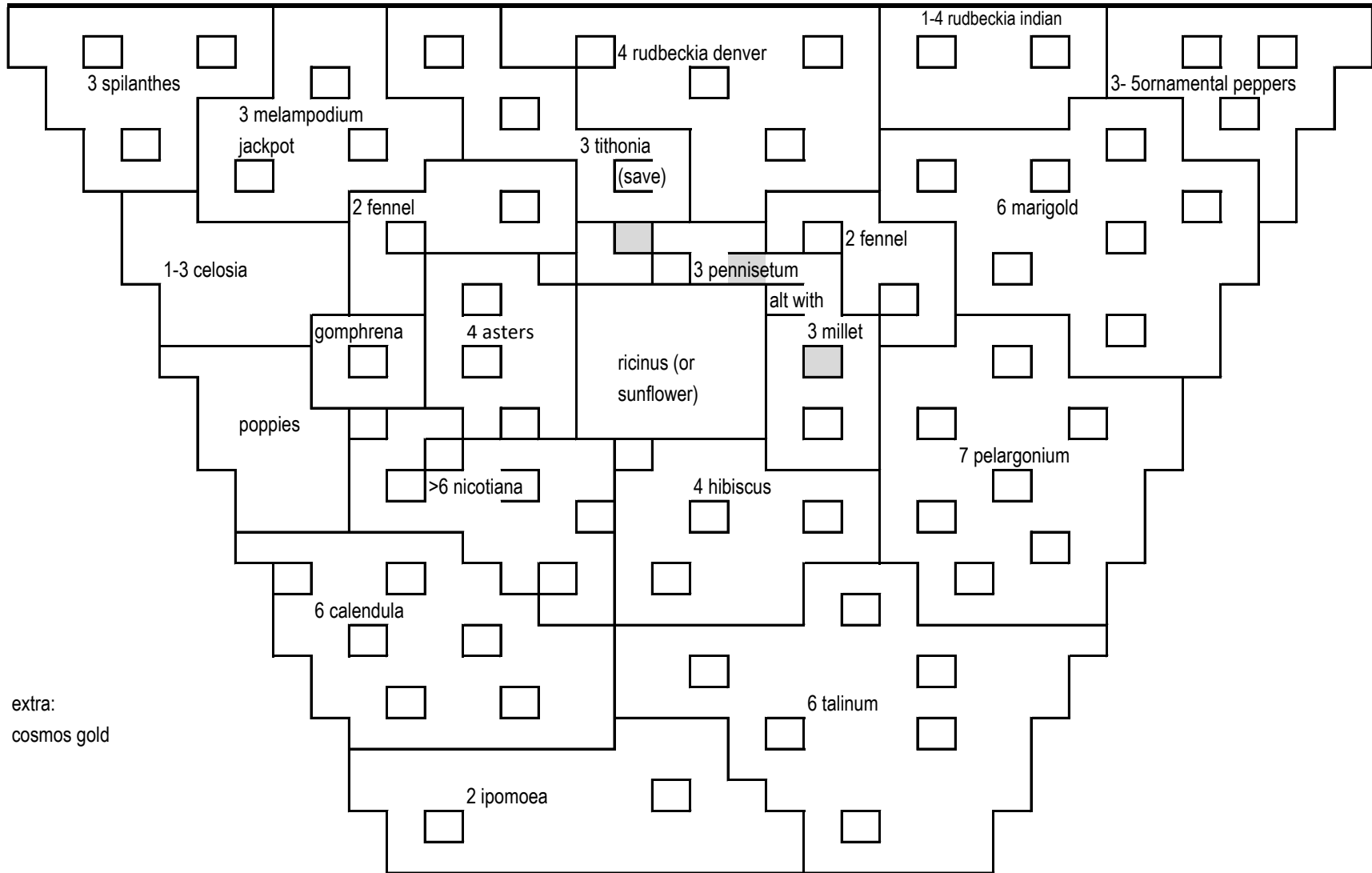
Ricinus (commonly known as Castor Bean) is a deadly poisonous plant - the source of Ricin, along with Castor Bean Oil. Utmost care should be used when placing and working with this plant.

Spilanthes is a lovely ground cover with leaves that will numb the tongue briefly when chewed. Known as the toothache plant.

Tithonia comes in short and tall forms. These were grown from both purchased and saved seed to see if the saved seed stayed true to the shorter stature of Fiesta del Sol.
